• We are in the final stages of completing a conservation easement with PA American Water on 220 gorgeous, forested acres of land surrounding the iconic Huntsville Reservoir, a vital drinking water source for 30,000 people and habitat for the precious species that thrive on these lands. As part of this project, we will also be completing a public access area to enjoy the views and enjoy natural paths through the woods.

- We helped and are helping private landowners to conserve 186 *NEW* acres of land that are quite simply precious to them, so special that they've taken this extra step with North Branch Land Trust to protect their land...*in perpetuity*.
- We completed 2.8 miles of the D&L National Heritage Corridor Trail near the PA DCNR Pinchot State Forest's Seven Tubs Nature Area. One more mile to go! Once completed, this section will be a vital link along the 165-mile D&L hiking/biking trail from Easton to Wilkes-Barre.
- We've increased our care and stewardship of our Preserves, land we own and hold dear, through active management to control invasives and planting more trees.
- We've increased our outreach with more events, social posts, educational offerings, and general outpouring of information on the natural world that supports us via social media, regional publications, local news outlets, partnerships with Discover NEPA and WeConservePA, and so much more.
- We haven't met all of you *yet!* so we continue to increase the number of events at our Preserves, plus, of course, our Annual Dinner and Barn Banquet. *We even held a "Tea Party" among the trees at Forest Echo in October it was delightful!*
- We launched The North Branch Land Trust Mary Louise and Eberhard Faber Conservation Scholarship Fund, to support the next generation of conservationists.
- We are launching an Outdoor Educator "Boot Camp" with the goal of empowering participants with the tools to provide meaningful walks and talks through our beautiful public lands and learn a little, *or lot*, about the natural world that lives within.

We hope you will consider supporting the mission of North Branch Land Trust, *your land trust*, during our Annual Appeal.
